**100 Club Requests Donations to “Survivor’s Fund”
After the Death of
Chambers County Sheriff’s Deputy Shane Detwiler**

The 100 Club announced today that donations are being accepted to its “Survivor’s Fund” which provides benefits to the dependents of peace officers and firefighters who are killed in the line of duty.

Deputy Shane Thomas Detwiler, 31, died in the line of duty on July 13, 2009, after being shot by a suspect while responding to a call at a residence where shots had been fired.

Deputy Detwiler had been a Deputy for only two months and was a State Game Warden prior to this tragedy. He is survived by his wife, Trish and three young children.

A \$10,000 check will be given to Deputy Detwiler’s family to assist with any needs they may have. Additional financial support for the family will be provided, after a review is made by the Club, to include current financial and children’s educational needs.
